Arborwell is providing them with an inventory with submeter accuracy, made possible through the usage of state-of-the-art GPS technology and iTree Streets, the most cutting-edge software for analyzing costs and benefits. The inventory will include between fifty and sixty thousand trees, and Arborwell is also identifying thousands of future tree planting locations. Due to the magnitude of this project, it is set run into early spring 2013 before reaching completion.
