Tips for Trees

Beware of Sudden Oak Death

Sudden oak death is a fungal disorder that manifests in bark tissue and kills trees. The fungus is mobile in water, and can be spread through drip-down, rain, and fog. With the rainy weather upon us, it is much easier for this disease to spread. Your arborist can use a trunk-applied fungicide to help support the trees' immune systems.

What's Happening to Your Redwoods?

Are your redwoods losing needles and looking a little thin? They could have issues with salinity and reclaimed water, or your trees could be experiencing drought stress which could lead to attack from insect and fungal pests. Your arborist will find the best mode of treatment to keep your redwoods in good health.
